THE BIBLE – WHAT IS IT?

WHAT BRINGS YOU HERE?

You are here hopefully because you want to know God better but:

- You may have found reading the Bible challenging
- Or been frustrated with the language
- Or wrestled with seeming contradictions

Some people wrestle with some of the bigger questions such as:

- How there be some many religions when we all have the same book?
- Are there answers for what is going on in the world contained in my Bible?



THE HOLY BIBLE – WHAT IS IT?

- Holy Bible = 'Separate Book' (gk biblia)
- Best selling book ever.
- Over 100 millions copies sold yearly
- Translated into 1808 languages
- Most completely supported ancient text in existence
- Many have a bible however few really read and understand it



THE HOLY BIBLE – WHAT IS IT?

 66 Books, 40 Writers – however God is the author

- Written over 1600 years
- 2,930 characters, 1,551 places
- It would take approx. 70 hrs to read
- Its message is expressed in all literary forms (narrative, poetry, prose, letters, etc.)
- That's a small beginning investment in time when you think about it


WHAT DOES THE BIBLE TELL US?

The Bible is God's telling of His purpose with mankind and this earth and His calling out a people for His name.

It contains history, prophesy, records of people and lands. It is a listing of his Commands and his Promises

It tells us the story of man's struggle with himself, and sin.

It will tell us what God has in store for us...



THE BIBLE IS:

- A guidebook for living your life before God
 - Standards for conduct, guidelines for knowing right from wrong provides a moral compass
- A book of the accounts of faithful men and women
 - These accounts emphasize the triumphs and failures of ordinary people –
 examples for us
- A refuge in trouble
 - People struggling with the issues of life use the Bible for strength
- A treasury of insight as to who we are
 - The struggle with our nature and the choices we must make



WHAT DOES THE BIBLE COVER?

Old Testament

- Record of the Creation
- Record of the Flood
- History of the Patriarchs
- Israel as a Nation
- History of surrounding nations
- Records of the prophets
- Prophesies of Nations & Christ

New Testament

- Gospels of Christ's ministry
- The record of Christ's life/death
- The spread of the Gospel
- The Epistles of the Apostles
- Development of early ecclesias
- Letters to the Ecclesias
- The Prophesy in the Revelation



WHY READ THE BIBLE?

... from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.



New Testament






THE BIBLE INTERPRETS ITSELF

THE BIBLE INTERPRETS ITSELF

- ✓ DO: Look first to the Bible for answers to your questions.
- ✓ DO: Read all of the Bible to find answers to your questions.
- ✓ DO: Write down questions (it may be awhile until you get the answer).

- DON'T: Expect quick answers.
- DON'T: Look at isolated passages and make conclusions.
- DON'T: get frustrated by the task and give up.

The Bible is one cohesive book.



HOW DO YOU STUDY?

- Build up over time
- Consistent and Concise
- Slow and Methodical
- Don't expect instant results
- Read with a friend or alone (and read it aloud!)
- Write down questions
- Have a concordance with you
- Take it in prayer



James 1:5-6




